

2026 – 2027 SACRED HEART SCHOOL UNIFORMS

General Uniform: Grades Pre-K through Six

Shirts

- All shirts/sweaters must be a solid color, with no additional trim colors, lace, or designs
- Shirts must be clean and always tucked in.
- Shirts may be white, light blue, or navy-blue plain polo with a collar and no logo. PK through 6th Grade students may also wear white, light blue, or navy-blue button-down shirts with collar.

Pants, Shorts, and Skirts/Jumpers

- Pants and shorts must be navy blue only for Grades PK – 6. (No khaki/tan colored shorts or pants in PK through 6)
- Girls in grade PK – 6 may wear navy skirts/jumpers.
- Students in 4th Grade and above need a belt if they have belt loops.
- Shorts may be worn April 1 - October 31 and must be an appropriate length.

Sweaters/Sweatshirts

- Navy blue *or* white vest or button-down cardigan/sweater or crew neck sweater may be worn.
- SHS logo sweatshirt and quarter-zip are permitted. Families will have a chance to order via the SHS apparel throughout the school year.
- No hoodies on uniform days. Hats, coats, jackets, and gloves may not be worn during the school day.

General Uniform: Grades Seven and Eight (Middle School)

Shirts

- The Middle School Students may only wear red polo shirts. All shirts/sweaters must be a solid color, with no additional trim colors, lace, or designs
- Shirts must be clean and always tucked in.
- Students must wear a uniform shirt under their sweaters or sweatshirts.

Pants, Shorts, and Skirts

- Pants, shorts, and skirts must be khaki only for the Middle School students. (No navy)
- Middle Schoolers must wear a belt.
- Shorts may be worn April 1 through October 31 and must be an appropriate length.

Sweaters

- Navy blue *or* white vest or button-down cardigan/sweater or crew neck sweater may be worn.
- SHS logo sweatshirt and quarter-zip are permitted. Families will have a chance to order via the SHS apparel throughout the school year.
- No hoodies on uniform days. Hats, coats, jackets, and gloves may not be worn during the school day.

Absolutely no temporary tattoos or writing on skin.

Shoe and Socks

- Students may only wear tennis shoes. Shoes must match.
- Absolutely no open-toed shoes, “jelly” shoes, sandals, wheels, flip flops, moccasins, boots, slippers, Crocs (or Croc-type) or clog type shoes.
- Boots may be worn to school but must be removed and replaced with tennis shoes upon arrival.
- Socks must be worn and matching.

Hair, Nails, Cosmetics, and Jewelry

Hair and Jewelry

- Hair for all students should be natural color, clean, well-groomed, away from the face, and not distract from learning.
- No facial hair or sideburns below the ear lobe.
- A hairstyle traditional to a boy's or girl's culture may be deemed appropriate by the principal.
- One pair of post earrings may be worn. No hoops or dangly earrings are permitted.
- Boys are discouraged from wearing earrings.
- Other necklaces, bracelets, or rings are not permitted.

Cosmetics and Nails

- Makeup is not allowed for any student.
- Lip protection, such as Chapstick, is allowed as long as it is clear.
- Perfume/body splash or hairspray may not be applied at school.
- Tattoos, temporary tattoos, and/or body piercings are not allowed for any students.
- Nail polish may be worn by girls in all grades but no words or inappropriate symbols.
- Nails must stay trimmed and at a reasonable length.



2026 – 2027 Sacred Heart School Uniform

The governing Board of Directors has established a uniform and dress code policy. It is the responsibility of the school professionals to enforce the policy. Parents/guardians are expected to understand and reinforce the guidelines of the established dress code and encourage proper grooming habits for their children. School uniforms give students a sense of identity that they are a part of the Catholic school community. It also gives importance to their “job” which is to be a successful student. Each family will be provided with a copy of the uniform dress code for each of the schools. Additionally, shirts should be always tucked in, and hats and coats/jackets are not to be worn inside the building. The Principal will determine the final interpretation of the appropriateness of dress and appearance of students of the school.

The dress code at Sacred Heart School serves several purposes:

1. to promote a sense of community and pride within our school and individual students;
2. to provide a means for a child to associate dress with behavior and to dress for success;
3. to create an environment of uniformity and safety for all students; and
4. to reduce clothing expenditures.

To promote these established principles, Sacred Heart School students are expected to follow the guidelines identified below. The school principal will determine the final interpretation of the appropriateness of dress. The following is meant as a set of general guidelines.

- All clothing should be clean, in good repair, and modest. On school Mass days and other days with special activities, students will be asked to be especially attentive to their appearance.
- No outerwear (i.e. scarves, coats, hats, boots, sweatpants) is permitted inside the school building during the school day.
- We *strongly* recommend student clothing and other personal belongings be marked with the individual’s first and last name. Any materials found will be placed in Lost and Found.

Civvies Day (Out-of-Uniform) Dress Code:

The Sacred Heart School Dress Code for Civvies Day requires that all students wear tennis shoes, shirts or blouses extending beyond the belt level, appropriately buttoned shirts, skirts and dresses at fingertip length, pants and shorts that are hemmed and without fraying. Jeans should not have rips, holes, tears, or frayed hems. Leggings may be worn by girls with a top, skirt, or dress that is at least fingertip length.

On out of uniform days any item of clothing that displays advertisements or slogans, which by their controversial or obscene nature disrupts the educational setting is prohibited. Modesty, respect for self, cleanliness and appropriateness will be indicators if the clothing is appropriate for uniform and non-uniform school days.

The administration reserves the right to make the final judgment on any questions concerning appropriateness for apparel.

Sweatpants and jogging (athletic warm-up) suits will be allowed if the following criteria is met:

- cannot be tight or form-fitting
- cannot hang loosely around the waist (i.e. sagging, no visible boxers or shorts underneath)
- no writing on the rear of pants below the waistline
- anything determined inappropriate by the administration will be asked to change into a school uniform provided by the parent or school.
- no drop crotch pants

All sleeveless shirts must have straps at least three inches wide and cover the shoulder.

Absolutely no hoodies may be worn as part of the school uniform.

Sacred Heart School prohibits wearing see-through tops, bare midriff, strapless, low-cut clothing, clothing with slits, or tops and outfits that provide minimum coverage, the wearing of head gear, except for authorized activities, clothes with slogans or advertising controversial or obscene in nature that disrupts the educational setting, and clothing with spikes or studs. Clothing with pictures of weapons, scenes of violence, skulls and cross-bones, inappropriate words/logos will not be allowed. Clothing with words written below the rear waistline will not be allowed. Coats, mittens, hats and scarves must be removed upon entering the classroom. *The school administration will have the right to designate which types of dress, fashion, fads, or appearance disrupt or distract from the educational program and may be a potential safety hazard.* The principal shall retain the authority to grant an exception for special occasions and/or condition
